"Materials and supplies are vital as well. ...Clipboards, notebooks, and tablets are easily accessible. ... An array of sharp pencils, crayons, paints, fat and skinny markers, and pens reside in cans and cubbies scattered around the room. Blank paper, lined paper, chart paper, butcher paper, index cards, and Post-its of every imaginable size and shape are within easy reach. No more mid-class refrains of "I forgot to bring a pen" or "Can I go sharpen a pencil?" We eliminate the opportunity for kids to waste time procuring resources. .... We create a culture of abundance, not scarcity, and flood the room with resources that are within arm's length."
